I'm a member. How can I get a password?

After your membership status is verified, an email will be sent to the point of contact that we have on record for your organization with a User ID and a password.

Can I change my password?

Our current technology does not allow you to change your password by yourself. If you have the need to change your password, please contact us and we will assign you a new one. Passwords will be changed yearly at your membership renewal.

What if I lose my password or User ID?

If your login information is lost or forgotten, you can send an e-mail to info@nhnonprofits.org. An email will be sent to the point of contact that we have on record for your organization with your User ID and password. No log in information will be given over the phone.

How do I know who the point of contact is for my organization?

If you are unsure of who we have listed as your point of contact, email info@nhnonprofits.org or call 225-1947 and we can tell you who that is.

Can my organization get more than one User ID and password combination?

Only one User ID and password combination will be issued per organization. You may share the password within your organization, and more than one person can log in at any one time.

Can my organization have more than one point of contact?

Because we realize that the point of contact for your organization may not be the person who will be accessing Grants Central the most, it is possible to have a primary contact for the organization AND a different primary contact for the members only website. A likely scenario would be if the Executive Director was the primary point of contact, but the Development Director would be using Grants Central. You can designate that the Development Director be the primary point of contact for member web access.
