

2022 NH NONPROFIT CONFERENCE & EXPO RFP FAQs

How do I submit a proposal?

Read the complete RFP and [submit your proposal online](#) by Tuesday, November 30, 2021

What is the deadline for applying to present at the conference?

The deadline for proposals is Tuesday, November 30, 2021. Selected presenters will be notified in January.

When and where is the conference?

The conference will be held on Thursday, May 26, 2022, at the Grappone Conference Center in Concord.

Can I submit more than one proposal?

Yes, but a separate proposal form must be completed for each proposed workshop.

How long are the workshops?

Workshops will be 60 to 75 minutes long.

When are workshops held during the day?

There will be at least four workshop blocks—two in the morning and two in the afternoon.

If I'm selected, do I have to stay for the whole conference?

After submitting your proposal, please hold the entire day until otherwise notified. All presenters are encouraged to attend the full conference and are welcome to attend workshops of their choice when they are not presenting.

What compensation is provided?

No stipends are available for facilitating a workshop. Lunch will be provided to all presenters as well as complimentary conference registration. Workshop presenters are listed on our conference website and in our program book. With an audience of over 200 nonprofit staff, board members and skilled volunteers, the conference is a great opportunity to highlight yourself and your organization.

Will the Center provide copies of my handouts and a laptop?

No, the Center will provide a screen, projector, and PC connecting cables. You will be responsible for all other materials, including laptops, VGA adaptors, microphones, speakers, and handouts.

In an effort to be "green" we will not be photocopying materials for breakout sessions. If you feel they are necessary, you will be asked to provide your own handouts. We will provide a place online where digital versions of session materials can be uploaded for conference attendees.

How are the proposals selected?

The Center reviews the submissions and selects the slate of approximately 20-24 workshops based on the evaluation criteria listed in the RFP.
